ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITES

We have an exciting and meaningful program of adult education planned for the spring. Our weekly Bible study via Zoom will continue as will the Book Group. Our Sunday after-worship events are described in more detail below. Even if you've not participated in the past, we hope you'll see something here that intrigues and inspires you to join one or more of the offerings.

"THE 7 LAST WORDS FROM THE CROSS" by Fleming Rutledge

On **February 26 and March 5**, we will be reading and discussing a collection of reflections on Jesus' last words from the cross by Fleming Rutledge, who has been a parish priest of the Episcopal Church in New York for two decades and has a reputation as an excellent preacher. She is the author of several books and regularly preaches and teaches around the United States. We will review one of her reflections on Jesus' last words to shed new light on how we think of the cross as we approach Good Friday and Easter. Each of her reflections ends with the words of famous hymns which we will use as a prompt for our closing prayer each week.

"CONVERSATIONS ON RACE AND FAITH" from the JUSTICE & PEACE MINISTRY TEAM

March 12 - Dr. Waziyatawin will join us to share about the **Makoce Ikikcupi** organization working toward land recovery and reparative justice to reestablish their spiritual and physical connection with their homeland. (date may be interchanged with the 19th)

March 19 - First in a series from Spark House **Dialogues On: Race**. Join us for this provocative and reflective series about our faith and race through readings, videos, and discussion. (date may be interchanged with the 12th)

March 26 - Warren Read, author of "The Lyncher in Me" about the June 1920 Duluth mob of 10,000, inflamed with rumors, who lynched three black men. The mob included his great-grandfather and his book explores the perspective of all involved and his discovery about his family's past. Come hear about a dark piece of Minnesota history and its injustices. We will also hear Warren's perspective about the subtitle of his book "A Search for Redemption in the Face of History."

WE EXPECT TO OFFER A NEW VIDEO AND DISCUSSION SERIES entitled: "How Did We Get?" by Dr. Sarah Ruble, Professor of Religion Gustavus Adolphus College. It will include 15-20 minute video sessions followed by group discussion on the topics of:

- How did we get the doctrine of the Trinity?
- How did we get the doctrine that Jesus was fully human and fully God?
- How did we get a church separate from Judaism?
- How did we get the doctrine of original sin?
- How did we get the doctrine of justification by faith?
- How did we get "liberal" and "conservative" Christianity?

You may recall, Dr. Ruble was the creator of the excellent video series *Race and Christianity in the United States* used in late 2021 through mid-2022. The exact timing of the new series is still to be determined as this is a program commissioned by our congregation and is currently being created, but we're looking at **April 2023**. Dr. Ruble will also join us in person later in 2023.

MARCH IS MINNESOTA FOODSHARE MONTH - The Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign raises money to help 300 food shelves statewide. 100% of donations received by FoodShare go into the FoodFund, which is then distributed to the food shelves, including Channel One Regional Food Bank and Food Shelf. The participating food shelves also collect money during the campaign, and the share of the FoodFund that any food shelf receives is apportioned based partly on the money it collects. **The more money that Channel One receives, the larger the share of the FoodFund it will receive.**

Channel One must purchase more food than ever before because demand is higher (food shelf visits are up 33%) and donated food is down (by 50% from USDA and by 60% from manufacturers and retailers). Inflation is causing purchased food to be more expensive than ever.



Donations are crucial right now to help Channel One continue its ministry. As Basil of Caesarea, a 4th century theologian, said: "If you want storehouses, you have them in the stomachs of the poor. Lay up for yourself treasure in heaven." Please prayerfully consider giving to this organization that is doing such vital work. Please put "Channel One" in the memo/note line of your check (payable to church) or PayPal donation and have your donations received at church by Monday, March 27. Thank you!



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING OFFERING (OGHS) will be collected on **Sunday, March 19.** For over 70 years, the **OGHS** has been helping Christians bring God's hope and healing to hurting people both in the U.S. and around the world. Since the closing years of World War II, OGHS has raised funds to support domestic and international development, fight poverty and its consequences, and bring aid and relief to communities torn by war or ravaged by natural disaster. In Galatians 6:9, the Apostle Paul encourages us to generously help others and

writes, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Please give generously as you are able!

OUR SPECIAL EASTER OFFERING on Sunday, April 9 will support two local charities this year: the Elder Network and the Jeremiah Program. Donations we will be shared between these programs:

- **Elder Network** serves individuals impacted by the limiting effects of aging through transportation programs, education programs, visitors and companions, and senior advocates.
- **Jeremiah Program** is a national organization with a mission to disrupt the cycle of poverty for single mothers and their children, two generations at a time. It supports single moms attending college with 1:1 coaching, childcare, housing and more. The Rochester-Southeast MN campus opened their doors to 40 single mothers and their children in July 2020. The campus includes an onsite child development center with capacity to serve up to 68 children.

These programs will benefit a diverse group of people representing a cross section of the residents of our community in need of assistance.
