# A chosen people... TO SHOW OTHERS THE GOODNESS OF GOD.

1 Peter 2:9

#### "BEING CHOSEN"

1 Peter 2:2-10

There is a phrase in our text from 1 Peter this week that has a pretty exclusivist ring to it. Peter describes the Church as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood." Hearing that we are "a chosen race" is enough to make many among us cringe. It is hard not to think of the many atrocities that were committed by people who believed just that; that they were a chosen race. What could Peter have meant by such a phrase? How exactly is the Church a chosen race?

Peter believes that the church has been chosen by God for a particular purpose- we are chosen to fulfill a mission. The particular mission that

God has given to the Church is not an exclusivist one. God calls the Church to proclaim the good news of God's love and forgiveness to all people- people of every nation, every gender, every status, and station. This good news is to be proclaimed in word and deed- deeds that demonstrate the love of God through loving service of our neighbors. We are not chosen to boast of our superiority, but to proclaim God's gracious welcome to all. We are chosen to be a new family; a family called from all nations of the earth and given the mission to love and serve God and our neighbors.

If it is true that the Church is called and given a mission by God; it is also true that the members of the Church are called and given a mission. That means you and I. It means that each and every one of us has been called by God to be a part of the Church, to play a role in its mission. My prayer this week is that each of us will ask God and ourselves once more what role we are being called to play in the Church's mission. How can we best be of service? How can our words and deeds best demonstrate God's love and grace to the world? For this we have been called and for this we have been chosen. Amen.



Have you ever had the experience of walking into a new place and suddenly seeing a familiar face? The fear and the nerves instantly dissipate as a smile spreads across your face and you are greeted by a friend? This feeling of relief, of welcome, of love- this is the promise of the Ascension of Jesus Christ.

At first glance, the resurrected Christ ascending through the clouds to take a seat at the right hand of God seems to mean that Jesus has left us; that he has broken his promise to be with us always, "to the end of the age." Yet Christians

throughout the ages have claimed that the opposite is true; because he has ascended Christ is even more present to us now. Because he is both human and divine, his physical presence above the heavens does not prevent his divine and spiritual presence being with us at all times and all places. The body of Christ is not only at the right hand of God, it is also spiritually present with us in Holy Communion, and in the life and love shared in the Church; the body of Christ. What is more, the risen Christ gives to us the Holy Spirit, his very spirit. The Spirit of Christ is thus within us, transforming us, guiding us, sanctifying us, and leading us to greater love of God and one another. Because Christ has ascended, he is both spiritually and bodily present to us across time and space. He is always with us, all of us, everywhere we are, until the end of the age.

There is thus nowhere we can go where Christ is not. There is no room that we can enter where Christ is not already present. Even when our mortal lives have ended and we have the opportunity to see God face to face- even then we will see the familiar face of Jesus Christ. In that most unique and transcendent and blessed moment- the humanity of Jesus is there to welcome us, to wipe away all fear and anxiety, and to walk with us into the fullness of God's love and glory. Thanks be to God for the presence of Christ beside us, within us, and waiting to accompany us into the glory of God's presence. Amen.

#### PENTECOST SUNDAY

"Still Speaking" - Acts 2:1-21

Try to imagine a long thin insect. Now watch that insect as it slowly, deliberately, and with a great deal of effort, climbs up a screen door. The insect loses its grip and begins to fall what must be a terrifying distance. Then, mere milliseconds after it falls from the screen, two large wings protrude from the insect, start flapping, and allow it to hover in midair. All that struggle and all that fear of falling, only to find out that he had wings all along.

Out of our love and concern for the church we often try to do everything we possibly can to help the church. This is a natural and even praiseworthy instinct. We absolutely should be of service to the church in whatever capacity we feel called. We should take this work seriously and do it well as a service to God. However, sometimes we can get so wrapped up in our work to help the church that we begin to resemble that insect. We struggle and fight to save the church on our own, all the time forgetting that we have wings. The Holy Spirit is present in the Church. God in the Holy Spirit transforms and guides and sustains the body of believers. We have wings because God is not only above us and with us, but also within us.

On this Pentecost Sunday we will celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples' 2,000 years ago. We will also celebrate our belief that the Holy Spirit is working within our congregation and our individual lives today. It is only by relying on the Holy Spirit, trusting in the guidance of God, that we come to be a part of God's mission in the Church. We are called not to rescue God and the Church, but to allow God to rescue us and lead us into God's mission here and now. This Pentecost, let us celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit by letting go of our illusions of control and welcoming God to work within us and guide us along the way. In the Holy Spirit we have wings, let us trust in Her and take flight!
