VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL is August 14–18 from 8:30–11:30 AM



MAKING IT EASIER TO DO MINISTRY TOGETHER!

Cabinet discusses best practices for organizing our collective work - Pastor Andrew Greenhaw

As with so many other areas of life, our congregation has undergone significant changes during the pandemic. One of the persistent challenges that we face is adequately staffing our Cabinet, committees, and ministry teams under our current structure. We still have unfilled officer roles on our Cabinet, we have multiple ministry teams that consist of only one member, and few people are eager to sign up for a three-year term of formal monthly meetings in the hopes of doing ministry with our congregation.



Over the last several months, Cabinet has been discussing these challenges and researching ways we might streamline some of our administrative work and make participating in ministry easier and more accessible to the congregation. Together the Cabinet read the book, "Governance and Ministry Rethinking

Board Leadership" by Dan Hotchkiss to help us think of potential ways to make our ministry more efficient and effective. We plan to continue these discussions with the goal of creating a proposal for structuring our ministry work in a more accessible and efficient manner. For any who are interested in this discussion we invite you to check out a copy of "Governance and Ministry" from the church office.

The changes we are discussing primarily relate to the "behind the scenes" work of the congregation. We are not discussing any changes to our programming itselfthere are no proposals to change our worship, our Christian education, or our youth programming. What we are hoping is to make it easier for the congregation to participate in these ministries and limit the amount of volunteer hours spent on governance and We will continue to inform the administration. congregation as our discussions move forward. Any proposed changes to the structure of our ministry will be presented to the congregation for feedback and discussion before it is given a trial run. We appreciate your trust in the leadership of our Cabinet and we look forward to your input as we seek ways to better serve God and our neighbors.

NEW BAPTISMAL FONT

Our new baptismal font is here! As stated in the 2023 Plan for Ministry, the Worship Ministry Team went ahead with a plan and contacted Nigon Woodworks Inc. of Rochester to design and build a font that would be aesthetic to our sanctuary and easier to move.



The wooden valance that covers the screen in our sanctuary was also built by them and installed in December. Both are beautifully crafted. We dedicated the baptismal font on Sunday, May 14. We are grateful to the donors of the alabaster bowl and the beautiful base to hold it. John Kruesel's General Merchandise and Auction Company has the old font and will find a home for it.



Hawthorne Helps is a local ministry assisting students and

their families at the Hawthorne Education Center. LOCAL BENEVOLENCE RECIPIENT

Family Service Rochester

was founded in 1965 as a nonprofit organization with a staff of three and the mission to support and enhance the dignity and quality of life for individuals and families in our community. Today, Family Service Rochester provides more than 30 programs across 12 different counties.

The Stewardship and Benevolence Ministry Team, in four-pronged keepina with our benevolence categories of Food, Housing, Disaster Relief, and Social and Racial Justice, donated \$1,000 from the Local Benevolence budget line item to Family Service Rochester to aid their important Meals on Wheels program. This program provides home delivered, dietetically correct, hot, nutritious meals and a friendly visit over the noon hour to residents who are not able to prepare or easily access a healthy meal. Volunteers deliver meals seven days a week in The meals are prepared under the Rochester. supervision of a licensed dietitian and special diets are available. Meals on Wheels is also a helpful resource for caregivers looking for support and respite.
