### "A PERFECT LOVING COMMUNION" - Matthew 28:16-20

As many of you know, we've partnered with Dr. Sarah Ruble of Gustavus Adolphus College to produce a video series engaging with Christian Doctrine and History entitled, "How Did We Get...?" The first video in our series is on that most confusing and most central of Christian doctrines, The Trinity. In this video, Dr. Ruble acknowledges that trinitarian language and theology can seem overwhelmingly complicated. This acknowledgment leads to the title of her conclusion to the video; after 25 minutes of theological and historical detail, Dr. Ruble asks, "So What?" What does the trinity mean for us? How does it help us to better worship, serve, and understand God?

At the end of Matthew's gospel, Jesus instructs the apostles to baptize in the name of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We certainly expect that

baptism will be in the name of God, so why give all three names, why not just baptize in the name of the Father? One of the claims of trinitarian theology is that there is no God before or beyond the relationship of the trinity. God is first and foremost the perfect loving communion of the three

equally divine persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This means that to baptize in the name of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is to baptize in the name of God, for the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God, and they are all God together in eternal loving relationship.

For we who believe in God as the creator and the redeemer of the world, the trinity means that the world begins and ends in perfect loving communion. We come from such perfect love and it is to such perfect love that we shall return. Our salvation involves being ever more closely united to the loving communion that is the Triune God. We can know something of that love in our lives in Holy Communion, prayer, and service to others. We are called to proclaim this love to the world, welcoming all of creation to return to life within the perfect loving communion of the trinity; or, as Matthew says it, "to baptize in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." Let us bask in the love of God and heed the call to share it with the world. Amen.

# **MAKING IT EASIER TO DO MINISTRY TOGETHER!**

Cabinet discusses best practices for organizing our collective work

As with so many other areas of life, our congregation has undergone significant changes during the pandemic. One of the persistent challenges that we face is adequately staffing our Cabinet, committees, and ministry teams under our current structure. We still have unfilled officer roles on our Cabinet, we have multiple ministry teams that consist of only one member, and few people are eager to sign up for a three-year term of formal monthly meetings in the hopes of doing ministry with our congregation.



Over the last several months, Cabinet has been discussing these challenges and researching ways we might streamline some of our administrative work and make participating in ministry easier and more accessible to the congregation. Together the Cabinet read the book, "Governance and Ministry Rethinking Board Leadership" by Dan Hotchkiss to help us think of potential ways to make our ministry more efficient and effective. We plan to continue these discussions with the goal of creating a proposal

for structuring our ministry work in a more accessible and efficient manner. For any who are interested in this discussion we invite you to check out a copy of "Governance and Ministry" from the church office.


The changes we are discussing primarily relate to the "behind the scenes" work of the congregation. We are not discussing any changes to our programming itself- there are no proposals to change our worship, our Christian education, or our youth programming. What we are hoping is to make it easier for the congregation to participate in these ministries and limit the amount of volunteer hours spent on governance and administration. We will continue to inform the congregation as our discussions move forward. Any proposed changes to the structure of our ministry will be presented to the congregation for feedback and discussion before it is given a trial run. We appreciate your trust in the leadership of our Cabinet and we look forward to your input as we seek ways to better serve God and our neighbors.

### "WHO IS NEED OF A PHYSICIAN?"

Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

Some Pharisees observe Jesus eating with some rather shady characters and they question his disciples, asking, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" Jesus, having overhead the question, replies, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick."

What comes next is an astoundingly clear demonstration that Jesus is indeed good news for those who are sick. A woman who has suffered 12

years with hemorrhages merely touches his cloak and is instantly made well. Next Jesus takes the hand of a girl who has just died and raises her to her feet, alive. Jesus ends 12 years of suffering from chronic illness in an instant; though the young girl had died, she was restored to life when Jesus took her by the hand. Jesus is indeed astonishingly good news for those who are sick, even sick unto death.

How do we figure in these stories? It depends on how we see ourselves. Do we see ourselves as these Pharisees see themselves- as righteous people with no need for a savior? Or can we see ourselves as the woman with the hemorrhage saw herself, as one who suffers a sickness, yet trusts in Jesus' ability to heal her? If we know ourselves to be perfectly righteous- if we believe we have no need for healing or forgiveness, there is little good news for us in the gospel of Jesus Christ. On the other hand, if we know that we suffer, that we struggle, if we can admit our need for a physician, then there is terrifically good news for us in Jesus Christ. Jesus offers healing, forgiveness, and new life to all those in need of it. Jesus has come to call not the righteous but sinners. That is best of all possible news for those of us who can acknowledge how far short we often fall of true righteousness.



### "BENEATH THE SURFACE OF THINGS"

Genesis 18:1-15

Last Monday, my six-year-old, Ruth, and I went on a hike with the express purpose of searching for fairies. Ruth likes fairies and wants to believe in them, but she's encountered a great deal of doubt among her kindergarten classmates. So, we hiked down to Quarry Hill and sure enough, right along the path we found the houses of

fairies! Two large stumps on the side of the path were decorated with tiny doors and porches and all kinds of cute little fairy knick knacks. Ruth's face lit up! You could see in



her face her world becoming larger and deeper; beneath the surface appearance of things there lurked a hidden reality. The woods around her were no longer just full of senseless plants, they were now the very dwelling place of fairies!

While Abraham is sitting by the oaks of Mamre, three men appear upon the horizon walking towards him. Abraham rushes to show the travelers hospitality, fetching them bread and water, milk and curds, and even slaughters a lamb for them. As they sit together under the shade of the oaks, one of the men repeats the promise of God that Abraham's wife Sarah will bear a child. Then, in the 13th verse, a remarkable switch occurs- the man continues speaking, but this time he is referred to as the Lord, as God! What is this? Is this human being God? That is certainly what Abraham perceives- beneath the surface reality of the human man standing before him, Abraham sees the divine presence. God appears to him in the appearance of the stranger sitting before him, receiving his hospitality.

One of the gifts of life in the Church is the opportunity to train ourselves to see the hidden reality of God beneath the surface appearance of things. We learn to trust not only in Abraham's perception of God in the face of the stranger, but also in our own perception: our ability to see God in the person of Jesus Christ, our ability to see the mystical body of Christ in the bread and the cup shared in communion. This Sunday as we read scripture, hear the preached Word, and **share in holy communion**, we will be training ourselves to see the reality of God in our world. Through our worship God helps us to see the divine presence in the strangers we encounter and empowers us to offer them hospitality and kindness. May God grant us such eyes to see in our worship this week. Amen.


