YOUTH GROUP

begins on Wednesday, September 13 from 6:30-8:00 PM in the Chapel.



Pastors Andrew and Shannon will lead a weekly gathering for our **6**th - **12**th graders where we will share a pizza meal and hear about one another's lives. Friends are always welcome! Each month at least one lesson will be spent on the following: spiritual practices, service to the community, important conversations, and a fun outing into the community. If you have any questions or are interested in pitching in, contact Pastor Shannon.

CONFIRMATION for our 6th-8th graders will meet on Sundays following worship beginning September 17, and parents are asked to join us for this first class. This important rite in our church is a time of



intentional study and reflection for those who are reaching the "age of reason" to affirm the baptismal vows made by their families in infancy. Over the course of the year these young people will dig into what it means to be a Christian, how it impacts their lives, and will culminate with the option to be confirmed, affirming their baptism and choosing to join the Church. Each month, we will travel to a different Christian setting to help understand the practical implications of our beliefs and to understand Christianity more broadly than just in our congregation. We look forward to a strong and diverse set of adult educational offerings this fall as we seek to fulfill our adult education mission: "Equipping members and friends with relevant theological learning so they are empowered to boldly speak their faith and share their gifts for ministries of all kinds."

WEEKLY BIBLE STUDY - We will once again have a weekly Bible study on Tuesday afternoons at 2 PM beginning September 12. This will be offered via Zoom. We will be reading the Acts of the Apostles together, moving through one chapter each week. To help us engage the multiple meanings of the scriptural text, we'll be framing our discussions with the four senses of scripture from the early Christian tradition: the literal, the typological, the moral, and the anagogical. This practice will help us to engage not only the past that the text describes, but also its relation to other biblical texts, its claim on our present moral life, and its proclamation about the future. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to join us on any Tuesday they are available, and no prior knowledge or attendance is needed to participate and enjoy our Bible study.

BOOK STUDY with PEACE and WINONA UCC -

Our church has been invited to join Rochester's Peace Church UCC and Winona's First Congregational Church UCC in an adult faith formation, 5-week book study series examining the newly acknowledged fifth stream of the UCC - the Afro-Christian Convention utilizing Yvonne Delk's book Afro-Christian Convention: The 5th Stream of the United Church of Christ. The study will be led by Rev. Danielle Bartz and Licensed UCC Minister Jerry Locula. These sessions will take place on Zoom, last for 75 minutes, and be on Tuesday evenings starting at 6:30 PM beginning September 26 and go through October. There will be no session on October 17 and the last day will be Halloween, so that session will be less content focused and more about "where do we go from here now that we know more about this important piece of our denominational history?" Our church has purchased 10 copies of the book and you can reserve your copy by contacting the church office. The office will also provide you an electronic copy of the study guide. The Zoom meeting link will be available closer to September 26.

"HOW DID WE GET" VIDEO & DISCUSSION SERIES

We are pleased to announce that this fall we will be using Dr. Sarah Ruble's newest video and discussion series "**How Did We Get**" on **six Sundays following worship on October 8, 15, 22; November 5 and 19; and December 10. The topics include:** How did we get the doctrine of the Trinity?; How did we get the doctrine that Jesus was fully human and fully God?; How did we get a church separate from Judaism?; How did we get the doctrine of original sin?; and How did we get the doctrine of justification by faith?

Each video and discussion session has been designed to be independent of previous weeks' sessions so even if you must miss one that's not an issue. The topics are fascinating and encompass questions we've all likely pondered – thus, you will want to attend as many as your schedule allows. Dr. Ruble has an engaging teaching style, and her series "Race and Christianity in the United States" was well received. You will likely recall that our church is sponsoring the creation the series which will be shared broadly across the UCC and beyond.

MONTHLY BOOK GROUP resumes with a new day and time on the **3rd Tuesdays at 10:30 AM.** All are welcome to join in these informal discussions of each book. This year all are in library book bags so there is no need to purchase any of them. Books are distributed at each meeting and also available in the church office and returned immediately following each meeting. The fall lineup includes the following:

CHANNEL ONE EMPTY BOWLS TO-GO will take place again this year on October 10 & 11. As part of this to-go style event, participants will enjoy gourmet soups and bread from local restaurants as well as hand-painted bowls - as a reminder of those who may not know where their next meal will come from. Bowls include those we painted on August 10 (pictured below).

Last year's event was a huge success, raising over \$86,000 - a testament to the support of the attendees for the mission and values of Channel One. All of the funds raised from the 19th annual Empty Bowls will directly benefit those who are facing food insecurity in the 14 counties served by Channel One.

In July 2023, the Channel One Food Shelf in Rochester was visited by almost 7,000 households, 362 of them there for the first time ever. That's the highest number of new households in Channel One's history, and these records likely will continue to be broken.

CHANNEL ONE VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Here are some ways you can participate in meaningful outreach ministry at Channel One Regional Food Bank and Food Shelf.

One option is to join our congregation's monthly group session in the Food Bank on the second Friday of each month from 9:00-11:00 AM. We usually repackage bulk foods into smaller packages for distribution in the Food Shelf and to Channel One's partnering agencies. Upcoming dates are September 8 and October 13. Another option is to assist with an ongoing urgent need for individual volunteers in the Food Shelf. There are about 250 shoppers using the service each day; a lot of volunteer support is needed to keep the shelves stocked and to assist the shoppers. Volunteers must be at least 16 years old. PARTNER KIDS UPDATE & VOLUNTER OPPORTUNITY

The Covid pandemic shutdown Partner Kids at Elton Hills School from the second half of



2020 into early 2022, when a few of us returned to our students. The program itself mutated to a new format for this past school year. The school is very focused on the reading skills of 2nd graders. The 2nd grade teachers proposed that available mentors each take two students for 30 minutes, rather than one student for an hour. These would be the same two students throughout the year. The 30 minutes would be largely focused on reading. This change worked well for everyone: students, mentors and teachers. According to the principal, we played a part in an "off the charts" improvement in second grade reading levels this past year.



This fall, all mentors will have two 2nd grade students for 30 minutes each week, focused on reading. We will no longer be following a single student through subsequent arades the school. at

advantage here may be that new mentors can be comfortable with an initial one-year commitment. We had four mentors working in this new format, plus one mentor finishing up with a long-term relationship with a 5th grader.



One of the most satisfying responsibilities for the Stewardship and Benevolence Ministry Team is supporting those in need in our community and in the world at large. The funds for this support come from two sources, special offerings, and the Local Benevolence line item in the church budget. To that end our ministry team tries to select charities that are most in need, and that our church community has shown an interest in supporting. At the time of this writing, our church has gifted the following to the greater UCC charities and to local charities:

- \$2,310 for the Turkey and Syria disaster relief special offering
- \$1,240 for a Good Samaritan offering
- \$1,005 for the One Great Hour of Sharing special offering
- \$2,555 for MN FoodShare (with money going to Channel One)
- \$1,000 to the Jeremiah Program and \$1,000 to Elder Network
- (\$1,979 from the Easter offering plus \$21 from the local benevolence line item to round up to \$2,000)
- \$690 for the Strengthen the Church special offering
- \$1,000 to Family Service Meals on Wheels from the local benevolence line item
- \$1,000 to The Landing MN from the local benevolence line item
- \$1,000 to Community Food Response from the local benevolence line item
- \$1,880 to Channel One from the special offering, which Think Bank matched bringing that total to \$3,760
