"LOVE THE FULFILLMENT OF THE LAW" Romans 13:8-14

In the movie, "Semi-Pro," Will Ferrel plays the player/coach of a struggling professional basketball team. During the team's many arguments, Will Ferrel's character attempts to stop the fighting by shouting his team motto at them, screaming,



"Everybody Love Everybody!" It's hilarious because of how obviously impossible it is- you can't force people to love one another no matter how loud you yell. The motto isn't a bad idea, it'd be great if everybody loved everybody, but this isn't a state of affairs that one can merely will into existence.



Romans 13:8, NRSV

Everybody loving everybody turns out to be what the Apostle Paul believes to be the fulfillment of all the divine laws of the Old Testament. "The one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law." To love someone is not just to feel nice and warm towards them- if this were so the commandment to love our enemies would be impossible. No, Christian love involves actively willing the best for someone else regardless of their attitude towards you. If you will what is best for someone, if you love them, then you will never do them wrong; you will fulfill all of your obligations towards your neighbor.

While it's great to know that we can follow the totality of the divine law simply by loving everyone, the fact remains that we aren't particularly good at doing so. A simple reminder is not enough, nor is shouting the command that "Everybody love everybody!" How do we go about fulfilling the law when loving everybody seems to be a little beyond our human capacities? For the Christian faith love is not something that we accomplish, rather it is a gift of God. Love is the gift of God's very presence, the presence of the Holy Spirit poured out upon us. Through receiving the love of God in the Holy Spirit we come to realize all that God has done for us in Jesus Christ. This inspires gratitude within us and a desire to love others as God has loved us. If God could love us even when we were undeserving, perhaps God can also empower us to love others whether we believe they deserve it or not. May this be our prayer and may we seek to always emulate the love of God.



"THE OUTPOURING OF GRACE"

Matthew 18:21-35

I often peer over the bridge on Broadway Avenue that crosses Silver Lake and look at the dam attempting to stop the flow of the Zumbro River there. I say attempt because the dam slows down the flow of the river, but it doesn't completely stop it- there is always excess water pouring over the top of the dam, refusing to be fully contained.

In our text this week, Jesus tells the story of the ungrateful servant. This servant owed a large debt to his lord which he could not pay. To avoid being sold along with his entire family, the slave begged for forgiveness, "Have patience with me and I will pay you

everything." His lord felt pity for him and forgave all his debt. Yet as he was leaving his lord's chamber, he ran into another servant that owed him a debt and he demanded payment. When this servant couldn't pay, he refused to forgive him and threw him into prison until he would pay the debt.

The story makes me think a little bit about that dam at Silver Lake. The Lord of the ungrateful servant has decided to shower him with grace, to forgive all his debts. This unbelievable good news, this new lease on life, has been poured out upon the servant. The recipient of grace and generosity and forgiveness this servant now has the opportunity to be a part of the continued flow of grace through the world. He has been made new and empowered to show grace and forgiveness himself, to be a part of what God is doing in the world, and instead he tries his very best to stop this outpouring of God's grace, to dam up the flow of forgiveness. He refuses to show to another the grace he has received.

Each week in our Sunday worship when praying the Lord's Prayer together we say, "Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors." We pray this to remind us all that God has forgiven us, to remind us of the grace we have received. And we pray it also to remind us that we are called to be conduits of this gracious love, to aid its flow through the world wherever and whenever we can. If you have an opportunity to show grace to someone in the coming days, welcome the opportunity, allow yourself to be a part of the flowing of God's grace into the world. Amen.

They created food boxes for the Commodity Supplemental

Food Program (CSFP). They assembled the boxes, filled them with 23 items of food each, and put 246 completed boxes on 40-box pallets. Food this month: 2 boxes of cereal; 1 bottle of fruit juice; 2 packages of lactose-free milk; 1 jar of peanut butter; 1 package of spaghetti; 1 bag of rice; 1 can each of chicken, chili and applesauce; and 2 cans each of pinto beans, mixed

vegetables, potatoes, green beans, tomatoes, and apricot halves. That's a total of 5,658 food items!

CSFP is a USDA program for low-income people over the age of 60 who live in a facility that does not provide meals. Channel One volunteers deliver a monthly food package and a newsletter with healthy eating and other educational information to those who are enrolled in the program.

Our congregation's recurring group sessions in the Food Bank occur on the second Friday of each month from 9:00–11:00 AM. The next one is October 13. You must use <u>our unique link</u> to sign up: https://corfb.galaxydigital.com/need/detail/?need_id=823703. Hope to see you there!



THANK YOU FROM HAWTHORNE HELPS

WOW! What a blessing The Congregational Church is to Hawthorne Education Center adult students. 180 essential items were collected and will be distributed through Hawthorne Helps in the next few weeks. The incredibly generous \$1,000 donation will be used to cover





the entire cost of 1 full month's service in addition to the purchase of winter gloves to supplement our Fall winter wear distribution. In this past school year 2022-2023, over 21,000 student shoppers received 3-4 essential items per person per visit which represents at least 73,773 items purchased or donated. In Fall 2022, approximately 400 winter items were given out. In Spring 2023, 325 garden plants were shared. Throughout the school year 530 bags of school supplies were packed and distributed to each new student with a welcome note.


