Isaiah 40:21-31



"THE POWER OF GOD"

There are times in our lives, in all of our lives, when we feel ourselves to be powerless. Sometimes we are powerless to stop the spread of an illness in our bodies or the bodies of a loved one. Other times we are powerless to stem the tide of addiction or mental illness washing over us. All of us are powerless to stop the process of our own aging and our inevitable mortality. Feeling this powerlessness can be terrifying; so terrifying that we often refuse to acknowledge it. We live in denial of the reality of our powerlessness. Yet, the Christian faith makes the bold claim that when we acknowledge our powerlessness, it is precisely then that we may find access to a great power.

The prophet Isaiah, when speaking to his people during the time of their exile in Babylon, told of the transcendent, overwhelming power of God. "To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. Lift up your eves on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing." So great is the power of the God who created the heavens and the earth that even the most powerful humans pale in comparison, for God "brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing." Yet as utterly transcendent as God is, the Lord chooses not to be distant from us. The all-powerful God promises to "give power to the faint, and strengthen the powerless."

It is the promise of God to give strength to the powerless that is the source of all Christian hope. On our own, relying solely on our own power, we are like newly rooted stems blown away by the vicissitudes of life. Yet when we acknowledge our powerlessness and wait for God, it is precisely then that the power of God comes to us. "Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." I do not believe this promise guarantees us a life without suffering, but I do believe it guarantees that no matter what we face and no matter how powerless we feel, God will give us the strength we need if we but wait upon Her. Let us take heart in the knowledge of God's abundant power and God's promise to renew our strength in our moments of greatest need.





"THE BREADTH OF GOD'S LOVE" Genesis 9:8-17

During the season of Lent, we focus on repentance and renewal- on naming the ways we have fallen short of our baptismal vows and renewing our commitment to following Christ. One way we fail to live into our baptism is by failing to appreciate the radical and total nature of baptism. We have a tendency to think of baptism as intended only for a few, for those whose parents were Christians, those who regularly attend church. We also have a tendency to think that only certain parts of ourselves are really known and claimed by God, as though our baptism only washed a part of us and God's covenant was made only with a portion of souls.



After the water recedes from the great flood, God says to Noah, "When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." This story reminds us of the universal nature of God's loving concern. The flood washed away the sin of the earth, just as baptism washes away our old lives. And just as we enter into the new covenant through baptism, so too did God make a covenant with every living creature on the earth following the flood. God's loving concern was never limited just to the people of Israel- it has always included all the creatures of the earth. Nor is God's loving concern today only for those presently within the church- God loves every living being. God intends for all people to be reconciled in the love of God and to know the joy of salvation.

Just as we believe that God's love extends to every person and every creature upon the earth, so too do we believe that God's love extends to every portion of our very selves, every hidden corner of our souls. There is no part of you that God does not claim and love. There is no part of you that is beyond God's power to love and redeem. You are God's beloved child. May we trust in the comprehensive nature of God's love and may we allow God's light to shine on every portion of our soul during this Lenten season.




THANK YOU TO CHANNEL ONE VOLUNTEERS! Many thanks to the 8 people who were the crew for our Food Bank group volunteer session on February 9: Janet Bartz; Ellen Bolterman; Annie Kramer; John and LuAnn Nicholson; Bob and Cheryl Roediger; and David Walters.

First, we checked **480 boxes** already packed for the USDA-sponsored Commodity Supplemental Food Program, and added a required package of beef stew if one was not already there. After a short break, we finished processing a

pallet of cups of green beans: putting 4 eight-ounce cups in a bag, 12 bags in a box, for a **total of 27.5 boxes or 1,320 cups**. The CSFP boxes will be distributed to the program's participants, and the green bean boxes have been added to the Food Bank's inventory for use throughout Channel One's 14 county service area.
