# **ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITES**

Sunday, March 3 - How to Talk to Kids About God. How do we inspire a passion in our children about God and their own spiritual lives? It can often feel like the "old" way of talking about God constructs a divine that is male, punishing, and angry rather than a loving God who is beyond human categories and is always seeking us out. Join Pastor Shannon as we talk about how to talk to kids about God in a way that encourages wonder and awe and to consider the importance of spiritual formation in our youngest.

Sunday, March 10 - What is Autism & Best Practices for Welcome. Following worship, join our guest speaker, Brandon Hendrickson, to learn more about Autism Spectrum Disorder and how we as a church can become a welcoming place for those with autism and their families. This is our first educational opportunity to prepare for welcoming folks with different disabilities into the life of the church. A Zoom link will be sent to those who want to attend virtually. About our speaker: Brandon Hendrickson has a master's in educational leadership from the University of Washington. He also has a 13-year-old with ASD, and has years of experience teaching science and philosophy to kids on the spectrum. He's the founder of Science is WEIRD (scienceisWEIRD.com), and runs the local tag/capture-the-flag group for kids who love intense play (rochestertag.com). He also runs Across the Divide (rochestertag.com/divide), a monthly event that cultivates good conversation among people who disagree about politics.

Sunday, March 17 - Adult Education on Environmental Justice with Guest Rev. Dr. Brooks Berndt. Join us immediately after worship in the Parlor for our guest speaker Rev. Dr. Brooks Berndt, Minister for Environmental Justice, Education for Faithful Action Team, United Church of Christ, National Ministries who will join us virtually to speak on environmental justice issues, UCC environmental justice history, what it means to be a prophetic church in addressing climate justice issues, the UCC creation justice churches program and why Christians and UCCers should care about the environment, how churches can address climate change and how to maintain hope.

Sunday, April 21 - Being Environmentally Responsible and Our Urban Forest. Join us immediately after worship in the Parlor for a discussion of our Urban Forest and all that it has to offer for our environmental outreach as well as for our spiritual development. This will mirror the Sunday School students' visit to the Urban Forest during Sunday School. More information to follow.

### **SPECIAL OFFERINGS**



**MARCH IS MINNESOTA FOODSHARE MONTH -** It's time for the annual Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign, which raises money to help 300 food shelves statewide, including Channel One Regional Food Bank and Food Shelf. The food shelves also collect money during the campaign, and the share of the FoodShare monies that any food shelf receives is apportioned based partly on the money it collects. Our congregation supports Channel One in this effort by donating money to it.

Donations are crucial to help Channel One continue its ministry, which distributed 12.4 million pounds of food last year throughout the 14-county region served. Approximately one in six people in that region is food insecure. Channel One's Food Shelf alone saw a record 8,506 household



visits last November, double the amount during the height of the pandemic. Funds are also used for other Channel One programs, such as creative delivery services to those who are unable to get to the Food Shelf and delivering prepared meals through the Kitchen Coalition program.

**OUR SPECIAL EASTER OFFERING** on Sunday, March 31 be supporting and shared between two local organizations: Bear Creek Services and Community Food Response (CFR).

• Bear Creek Services provides support to individuals with developmental disabilities and traumatic brain injuries. Their staff form a partnership with the enrolled individuals with the goal of maximizing their potential and enjoying all that life has to offer. They provide this support through person-centered programs that respect everyone's dignity and desires.



 Community Food Response is a non-profit, volunteer-led organization serving hungry adults and children in the Rochester area since 1993. Volunteer drivers collect food donations from hospitals, restaurants, cafeterias, businesses, and grocery stores and bring it to CFR's food distribution site. There it is sorted and made available to anyone facing food insecurity.

These programs will benefit a diverse group of people representing a cross section of the residents of our community in need of assistance. CHANNEL ONE – Please join us for meaningful outreach ministry at Channel One Regional Food Bank. Our congregation's monthly group volunteer sessions occur on the second Friday of each month from 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM. Spring dates are March 8, April 12 and May 10. We usually re-pack bulk foods into smaller packages for distribution throughout the Channel One network or pack food boxes for the Commodity Supplemental Food Program or the high-rise delivery program. Signing up to volunteer must be done via our unique page on the Channel One volunteer site, available on our church website event page: <a href="https://www.congoroch.org/news-events">www.congoroch.org/news-events</a>. Every volunteer needs to have a sign-in account, which can be created the first time you volunteer. We work hard but have fun too! 14,148 volunteer hours were recorded in 2023 in the Food Bank and onsite Food Shelf. Channel One couldn't provide the food and services to the 14 counties it serves without that help. Please consider giving some of your time to alleviate food insecurity!
